### Who We Are

Since our founding in 2002 by a group of innovative parents and professionals, Vista has been a pioneer in providing autism services. At The Vista School®, students with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) learn to communicate and to function independently in daily life. Vista Outreach Services helps students with autism to navigate the social and educational complexities of their public and private school environments. Vista Adult Services was established in 2014 to meet the employment, training, and housing needs of adults with autism.

### What We Do

Vista Outreach Services provides a wide array of affordable, itinerant autism support services to students enrolled in both public and private schools and the educators that serve them. We believe that putting the needs of the student first through Applied Behavior Analysis, a data-driven, proven approach to autism treatment, does what it takes to achieve student success. Vista Outreach Services currently supports students and educators in school districts within a 50-mile radius of Hershey, PA. Our services include:

1. Direct (related) services working with students.
2. Consultative services to district autism support classrooms, students, and teachers.
3. In-service trainings.

2. School district or private school and Vista Outreach Services enter into contract.
3. Vista Outreach assigns or hires an itinerant staff member to provide services.
